YEAR 1

READING

Decoding

Secure Set 1 & 2 Speed Sounds
Can sound out CVC/CCVC/CVCC words without prompt
Read words containing taught GPCs and -s, -es, - ing, -ed, -er & -est
Read words with contractions

Word recognition

Reads 100 familiar words and familiar signs and labels around school

Pattern & Rhyme

Can identify repeated words in reading Recognising and joining in with predictable phases Recite some poems by heart

Comprehension & Understanding

Expects reading to make sense and checks if not Answers simple literal questions Retells with accuracy Become familiar with key stories, fairy & traditional tales

Deducing

Able to predict what happens next in stories

Intonation & Expression

Knows to stop at full stop Reads aloud with appropriate expression Reads from texts with pace and expression

Grammatical features

Uses Grammar to decipher unfamiliar words

Research

Knows difference between fiction and non-fiction

WRITING

Sentence structure

Understand how words join to make sentences Joining words and sentences using 'and'

Text

Sequencing sentences to form short narratives

Write sentences

Discuss what they have written and read aloud

Spelling & Phonics

Applying phonic knowledge

Regular plural noun suffixes e.g. dog/dogs wish/wishes

Suffixes that can be added to verbs (-ing, -er, -ed) How the prefix un- changes the meaning of verbs and adjectives

Punctuation

Use capital letter and full stop correctly and use a capital letter for 'I'

Introduce the following to demarcate sentences

Capital letters

Full stops

Exclamation mark

Question mark

Use of capital letters for names and personal pronouns

Grammar

Write with grammatical agreement – using the standard form of verbs e.g. go/went

Handwriting

Use correct formation of lower case letters, capital letters and digits 0-9

Speaking and Listening

Speak clearly and convey simple meanings to an adult

Follow patterns in familiar stories Listen to others and respond.

Talk ordered when recounting a simple event and matters of immediate interest.

Able to use gesture to highlight meaning (role play)
