
P.E. Kits

Live zoom sessions

- Pupils should attend all live zoom teaching sessions per day where
 possible. These sessions consist of the teaching of the lesson of that
 day and will support the pupil when completing the set activities.
 This is particularly important during the English sessions as activities
 cannot be completed successfully unless the pupils access the live
 link.
- Pupils should arrive on time for each session.
- Pupils should remain focused during the session with microphones muted unless answering a question.
- Pupils should be suitably dressed during the sessions.
- Pupils should not eat during the live zoom sessions.
- Please try to ensure that there is no background noise that could be distracting for your child.
- The chat facility will allow your child to speak only to the teacher and not to other pupils in the zoom session.
- Zoom codes are changed daily as a safeguarding measure.

Google Classroom

- All pupils have access to google classroom and should do so every day.
- The zoom links and activities for each day will be available from 9am.
- The power points used during zoom sessions are available to be used in your own time.
- Please ensure work completed is handed in in a timely manner.

EXPECTATIONS FOR READING AND WRITING

Spring term—Reading

- Predict what will happen next
- Identify how language and structure contribute to meaning in nonfiction books
- Retrieve information from non-fiction books and other sources
- Compare examples of work by the same author
- Identify how language and structure contribute to meaning in instructions
- Recognise and evaluate the features of poems
- Identify root words, prefixes and suffixes in reading as well as spelling
- Understand that the spelling of some words needs to be learnt specifically (year 3 word list)

Spring term—Writing

- I can write an adventure story
- I can write instructions and commands
- I can identify main ideas and summarize them
- I can use my computing skills to record non-fiction information
- I can compose a calligram
- I can use the perfect form of verbs to mark time and clause
- I can write dialogue with inverted commas
- Ensure punctuation is correctly used when typing work.
- Join letters using diagonal and horizontal strokes
- Understand which letters, when adjacent to one another are best left un joined
- Keep all letters of an even size
- Make sure the downstrokes of letters are parallel
- Space all line of writing so ascenders and descenders of letters do not touch



ACTIVITIES TO DEVELOP YOUR CHILD'S WRITING

- Encourage children to read for at least 10 minutes a day (great readers make great writers)
- Practice their spellings everyday
- Encourage children
 to play games with
 writing such as
 'Find the word'
 where children
 search for a word
 in the story and
 look up the definition
- Encourage children to write a letter to a family member/ keep a journal
- Invest time in writing
