

ACTIVITIES TO DEVELOP YOUR CHILD'S WRITING

To develop writing the children need to develop their fine motor skills. Examples of activities are:

- Threading, posting and slotting toys.
- Poking straws into holes.
- Pasta necklaces.
- Play dough
- Weaving around cardboard
- Pipe cleaners and colanders
- Beads on spaghetti.
