

EXPECTATIONS FOR READING





Books to read and share with your child

Please check the Year 2 reading list available on Google Classroom!

As many information texts as possible!

- Read accurately by blending the sounds in words.
- Use their phonetical knowledge to decode words whilst reading.
- Start to familiarise themselves with the Year 2 common exception words.
- Read aloud books, tackling new words well.
- Use the first letter of a word to check spelling or meaning in a dictionary.

EXPECTATIONS FOR WRITING

- Write commands using verbs and adverbs
- Write a list using commas
- Write questions and use question marks
- Write statements
- Use apostrophes to show possession
- Write noun phrases
- Write from memory simple sentences, dictated by the teacher
- Use the first letter of a word to check spelling or meaning in a dictionary
- Spell by -segmenting spoken words into phonemes and representing these by graphemes, spelling many correctly
- Spell by learning new ways of spelling phonemes for which one or more spellings are already known, and learn some words with each spelling, including a few common homophones
- Learning to spell common exception words
- Learning to spell more words with contracted forms
- Write neatly, keeping all the letters of an even size
- Form lower-case letters evenly
- Join some letters together
- Write capital letters and digits the correct size
- Use correct spacing between words.
