St Joseph's Wider Curriculum

The wider curriculum focus this term is 'Our Heritage'

During this theme the school will be celebrating the cultural diversity of our school community and Black History Month.

The children will be looking at significant people from the past and present who have helped shape modern day society.

PSHE objectives will also be taught throughout the unit of work. These include:

- To value the different contributions that people and groups make to the community.
- Diversity: what it means; the benefits of living in a diverse community; about valuing diversity within communities -
- Stereotypes; how they can negatively influence behaviours and attitudes towards others; strategies for challenging stereotypes
- Prejudice; how to recognise behaviours/actions which discriminate against others; ways of responding to it if witnessed or experienced.

There will be many opportunities throughout the term for the school and the wider community to come together to celebrate 'Our Heritage'

Events include: a school food festival, fashion show, story tellers and inspirational speakers.

Reading including phonics

Expectations for Autumn 2

- Reading for 10 minutes at least 4 times a week
- Children to bring in own reading books if they wish or borrow from classroom/ school libraries
- Complete reading journal at least once a week
- Regular Library visits in school

Objectives for Autumn 2

- -l can draw on information given by my teacher
- I can understand a flow chart or diagram that explains a process
- I can read a poem and find patterns and repeated language
- I can role play by acting as a hero or villain
- I can explain why something happened
- I can read a poem aloud with others

Expectations for Autumn 2

- Write an adventure story
- Write a set of instructions

Objectives for Autumn 2

- Record information from non-fiction sources
- Write noun phrases
- Write a list using commas
- Revisit and build upon previously learned skilled from KS1
- Plan paragraphs for a story
- Join letters using diagonal and horizontal strokes
- Keep all letters an even size
- Make sure the down-strokes of letters are parallel
- Space all line of writing so ascenders and descenders of letters

Key vocabulary: Fairy tale, Fiction, Setting, Character, Characterisation, statements

Ways to help your child and useful resources

- Encourage children to read for at least 10 minutes a day (great readers make great writers)
- Practice their spellings everyday
- Encourage children to play games with writing such as 'Find the word' where children search for a word in the story and look up the definition
- Encourage children to write a letter to a family member/ keep a journal
- Invest time in writing

To revise, consolidate and further develop skills learned in KS1 on the topics of subtraction, multiplication and division

Objectives for Autumn 2

Calculations:

- Subtract numbers with up to 3-digits using a written method
- Recall and use x and ÷ facts for the 3 times table
- Recall and use x and ÷ facts for the 4 times table
- Recall and use x and ÷ facts for the 8 times table
- Use efficient written methods to times a 2-digit and 1-digit number

Key vocabulary: place value, hundreds, tens, ones, column, part-whole, exchange, difference, multiply, divide, groups of

Science

Expectations for Autumn 2

Children will learn about how they need light in order to see things, notices that light is reflected on some surfaces, recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous, understand that shadows are formed when light from a light source is blocked by an opaque object and understand how the size of a shadow can change

Objectives for Autumn 2

- To describe the reflections when light is reflected from surfaces.
- To record observations and make sense of them.
- To describe how shadows are formed.
- To design and carry out a fair test.
- To research and gather some key facts about how mirrors have been made over the centuries.
- To research and gather some key facts about how mirrors have been made over the centuries.
- To make a simple mirror and create a list of the key uses.

Reflection, travel, shadow, straight line, retroreflective material, opaque, measure
