Online Safety

The start of the new term will always begin with online safety lessons for every child. The term being no exception. Our pupils are very honest and will open up and share their stories of what games and films they play and watch. In our Computing lessons we teach the children how to use technology safely, but we are still increasingly alarmed to hear about some of the games, APPS and films your children are accessing at home. The PEGI ratings do not correspond to the difficulty of a game, rather the suitability of the content. Again many of your children have openly informed us they are playing games such us GTA 5 (rated 18), Call of Duty (rated 18), Fortnite (rated 12) and watching films such as The Joker (15) all of which contain gratuitous violence, inappropriate language and scenes of an adult content. We urge parents to look carefully at content and device settings before allowing children to access these games.

Securing Devices

Lots of children have told us they were lucky enough to have received internet ready devices, such as phones and tablets. With this in mind we have listed below APPS and sites which can be used to monitor usage and block anything you do not want your child to access.



KS1Digital Club

Since the Autumn term, children from Reception to Year Two have been coming to learn and develop their digital skills in Digital Club. Children have been learning to identify and find letters, numbers and symbols on a keyboard, playing Interland to learn about Online Safety, coding a dragon's castle and creating FlipGrid's about their favourite book characters. Children have expressed that they love coming to Digital Club (informally known as Digi-Club) every week to enhance their Computing skills in online safety, computer science, information technology and digital literacy.

Computing at St Joseph's

Children have been doing various activities that demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of Computing.

Year 1 and 2

Year 1 have been working on Lego Builders where they develop early skills of Coding. They have been introduced what an 'algorithm' is and the logical thought process of the way that computers are programmed.





Year 3

Children in Year 3 have demonstrated their knowledge about being safe online, specifically for Safer Internet Day. This year's theme was, **Want to talk about it? Making space for conversations about life online**.



Year 4

Children in Year 4 have been learning how to make music online. The lessons encourage children to discuss and experiment with the main elements of a piece of music and allows them to compose themselves.



Year 5

Children in Year 5 are planning and designing their own games! These lessons encourage them to use their imagination and create their own characters in a story.



Year 6

Children have been learning how to create their own text-based adventure stories where they created and edited an existing fairytale story.
