Outdoor learning is an important part of our early years curriculum and we kindly ask that you provide your child with a pair of labelled wellington boots to support this. If possible, we ask that these remain in school to ensure we are able to learn outside in all weathers. Visits to the Forest School will be on Mondays and Thursdays.

Our main topics for this half term will be 'Traditional Tales' and our rhyme focus which will be 'Humpty Dumpty and ,A,B,C,D,'. To help us with our topics, could you please talk to the children about stories that are traditional like The three Little Pigs, what happens? How did the characters feel? What happens at the beginning? Middle? End? What would you do and say in the story?

Some ideas to support your child with your child with our topics.

- Sing lots of nursery rhymes and particularly Humpty Dumpty, A, B, C, D, Miss Polly Had a Dolly Teddy, Teddy Bear and Ten in the Bed.
- Look at the numbers on the front of the buses, doors and all around.
- Count the trees, people at the bus stop etc.
- Matching Numeral to amount.
- Counting in order what comes next.
- Ordering Numbers.
- Counting above 10.
- Recognising 1-10 and 15-20.
- Beginning to represent numbers with marks on paper, fingers and numeral.
- Symmetry.

- Repeating patterns.
- Share lots of stories.
- Give them lots of opportunities for mark making and drawing.
- Encourage them to tidy away their toys etc. as this is good practice for nursery tidy up time.
- Encourage children to put their own coats and shoes on, this will help develop their independence.
